Are You a High School Grad or Adult Interested in a Career Path in Community Health or Social Work?

The Trauma-Informed FlourishCare™ Pre-Apprentice Training Program is a competitive six-month paid internship open to people of any age with a high school diploma or GED.

This paraprofessional training will prepare you for a career track in Behavioral Health, emphasizing recovery for people with substance use and other behavioral health needs throughout Kentucky.

Trauma-Informed Care (TIC) promotes a culture of safety and empowerment to help people heal from trauma and adverse childhood experiences (ACE's).

PROGRAM DETAILS

- 6-month session beginning October 2024. Applications will be accepted in Spring 2024.
- Open to Kentucky residents only
- Approximately 130 hours classroom and experiential learning
- Receive a \$5000 Living Stipend
- Peer Support Specialist Certification, if lived experience with mental health
- Program graduates eligible for Apprenticeship Program including career placement services and career pathway opportunities

Opportunities for Pre-Apprenticeship Graduates

After completing the pre-apprentice internship, interested pre-apprenticeship graduates may apply to participate in a Trauma-Informed Flourishcare™ community health worker apprentice program. An apprenticeship provides opportunities for additional certification and training, which may result in a higher salary and more career opportunities.

- Full-time employment with benefits at a primary care site
- Work in, or close to, your own community
- \$7,500 stipend to supplement income during apprenticeship
- Continued training and certifications: Community Health Worker and Community Support Associate
- Gain a year of work experience in the behavioral health field
- Certified CHWs provide billable services
- Advance lifestyle medicine and health equity as a certified CHW

An apprenticeship is just one path for pre-apprentices who have completed training. Participants can pursue a variety of options:



Bachelor's Degree in Social Work or Organizational Leadership and Learning



Employment as a Peer Support Specialist



Other employment as desired
